

20. Re: Letter from Rosali Greenwood dated October 14, 1972
Stormont Interchange and Noise Readings on Canada Way
and Stanley
-

Appearing on the Agenda for the October 23, 1972, Council Meeting is a letter from Mrs. Rosali Greenwood concerning Stormont Interchange and a request for noise readings that have been taken at Canada Way and Stanley.

A. Council on October 16, 1972, directed the Manager to bring down a report on the proposed connection with the Stormont Interchange of the Freeway via Newcombe Street and McBride Boulevard, and a planned eastward extension of Edmonds Street to connect with the Stormont - Newcombe - McBride route. Council following a review of the report may decide to approach Victoria to determine the position of the Department of Highways in regard to the completion of the Interchange.

B. Noise level readings were taken at Canada Way and Stanley by the Burnaby Health Department for two reasons: as a participating member of the Regional Study on Noise and for Municipal information. Both readings were taken for preliminary information on overall noise control and should not be used to form specific opinions. The Health Department is presently gathering information on noise emission levels which will be presented in the official report on noise control requested by Council for the latter part of February, 1973. The Chief Public Health Inspector believes that the release of partial information at this time could be misleading, and recommends that the release of such information be deferred until February of next year.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

THAT she be advised that further information on the status of Stormont Interchange will be forwarded to her when it becomes available.
