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#### MONTHLY REPORT

Dear Sir:

I have the pleasure of submitting a report for this Department for the month of August 1972.

Physical examinations for the kindergarten children who will be starting school in September continued throughout the month. The advantages of having these examinations throughout the summer months is two fold, the parents have the opportunity of having the defects corrected before school opening and also the teachers may be alerted in September of any handicaps or any physical difficulties which may impede the childs learning capabilities.

A new routine for Pre-natal classes was tried out during July and August. Classes were held three mornings a week for two weeks instead of the usual once a week series. Reaction from nurses and mothers was favorable and it is likely that this routine will be adopted for summer months in the future. Evening classes continued as well with a very heavy enrollment.

The public health nurses continued to screen the applicants for the Meals on Wheels program. There are 58 people receiving these meals which are delivered to the homes from three depots in Burnaby. These depots are located in Southeast Burnaby, Southwest Burnaby and North Burnaby. Many dozens of volunteers arrange regular delivery and visiting for those people who have requested this service. The advantage of the nurses visiting is to assess any other needs that these people may have as they are all handicapped or aged.

It is with regret that we report the death this month of Miss Mary Shand the first Nursing Supervisor of the Burnaby Health Department. Miss Shand served with the Burnaby Health Department from 1938 until 1952.

Considerable larviciding in stagnant waters, ditches, etc. for the control of mosquitoes has been carried on throughout the Municipality. To date Burnaby has not acrial sprayed or adulticided.

There was a slight increase in the incidence of Communicable disease this month with a total of 22 cases reported. Of these there were 10 infectious hepatitis, 5 tuberculosis, 3 each chickenpox and pediculosis and I salmonellosis.
