Following for your information is the report of the Medical Health Officer covering the activities of his Department for the month of August 1973.

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### MONTHLY REPORT

Dear Sir:

I have the pleasure of submitting a report for this Department for the month of August 1973.

During the recent Summer Games members of the Health Department staff volunteered their services in various capacities. The service was voluntary and given on their own time and was primarily to assist in any emergency situations and general health services.

During the month a pilot project was held for senior citizens under the auspices of the Burnaby Parks and Recreation Department. The project held at Edmonds House with a group of 80 senior citizens for ten morning sessions. Dr. Moshefeldenkrais from Tel Aviv, Israel was the leader and the group participated under his instruction in a series of gentle body movements designed to give them greater mobility and general feeling of well being. Miss Mary Ross of the Burnaby Health Department staff was one of three evaluators appointed by the Deputy Minister of Health, Dr. George Elliott, to evaluate this program.

Miss Lynda Thornton was on leave of absence during the summer to attend a course on retardation in England and Sweden. This was the field work following a night school course at the University of British Columbia. Miss G. McIntyre was on leave of absence during the summer for a six week Family Life Program at the Lakehead University, Thunderbay, Ontario, dealing with all aspects of family living and sex education. These nurses will be sharing the information from these courses with the staff during the year.

Mrs. W. Randi has been granted a one-year leave of absence for maternity leave.

Three new nurses were appointed this month to replace three former staff members, Mrs. M. Barnes, Miss C. Wright, and Mrs. C. Whitman all of whom have their B. S. N. from the University of British Columbia.

The Public Health Inspectors attended lectures regarding Swimming Pool Regulations and Garbage Collections given by Mr. B. Williams and Mr. G. Mullis.

The incidence of communicable diseases remains at the usual summer low with 23 cases reported. Of these there were 11 gonorrhea, 8 infectious hepatitis, 2 pertussis, 1 salmonellosis and 1 mumps.
