REMARKS: There were two armed robberies during the month, and the culprits have been arrested and charged in each case and are presently being dealt with by the Court. One other robbery with violence involved an unknown youth on a bicycle grabbing a lady pedestrian's purse and riding away. The lady later accosted him in an underground parking area of an apartment and the youth, aged about 14 - 16 yrs., punched her in the stomach and ran off. This matter is being actively investigated.

A 14-year-old Burnaby youth and another juvenile from Calgary are being dealt with in juvenile court after admitting setting seven fires and committing seven break-ins in Burnaby during the month. There were no major police problems encountered during the Canada Summer Games. Parking and traffic control assistance was supplied by our Auxiliary members, and excellent co-operation was given by the Canadian Armed Forces to cope with the added workloads.
