REMARKS:

On the 16th May 1973, the Dairyland Employees Credit Union was robbed by two men who broke into the building and waited for employees, then forced the Asst. Manager to open the vault. One culprit was armed with a sawed off shotgun and the other had a knife. An estimated \$50,000.00 was stolen. Investigation is continuing, but to date no arrests have been made.

There were four other robberies reported, all of a more minor nature; and two of these have been solved and charges laid at time of this writing.

A number of fires of suspicious origin have been reported to date this year and extraordinary measures are being taken to identify the culprit(s) and/or prevent further incidents of this nature.
