REMARKS: Six robberies were reported during the month involving two Service Stations, a corner grocery, two private citizens and the T. Eaton Company (Brentwood). Charges have been laid regarding the T. Eaton Company robbery and the two Service Station robberies, and very active investigation is continuing on the three unsolved ones. There appears to be an upsurge of minor robberies throughout the Lower Mainland and our field members are utilizing extraordinary measures and concentrated patrols to try to curb this type of offence. The victims are mainly late night Service Stations, corner grocers or private citizens walking alone or hitchhiking. The culprits have been exhibiting knives or small guns to intimidate the victims and have realized only small amounts of money, or in some cases have fled with nothing.
