

15. Re: Lane Between Deer Lake and Dale Avenues

The Parks and Recreation Commission on February 7, 1973 received the following letter dated January 18, 1973, from Mr. D. A. Copan, President, Century Park Museum Association:

"The Building Committee of the Century Park Museum Association is presently considering enlarging the area of Heritage Village contained within the chain-link fencing in order to embark upon a building program to prepare for the opening of the Village to the public for the 1973 season.

The Committee would like to include the lane abutting the Village property along the creek joining Deer and Burnaby Lakes denoting our eastern property line.

The Century Park Museum Association respectfully requests the Parks and Recreation Commission to apply to the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the District of Burnaby to have the lane between Deer Lake Avenue and Dale Avenue running from Canada Way to Deer Lake Avenue 'stopped-up and closed.'

With the above-mentioned lane 'stopped-up and closed' our Committee would then be in a position to proceed with the erection of chain-link fencing which would permit a more viable use of Heritage Village property."

The Commission resolved to request Council to favourably consider the "stopping-up and closing" of the lane between Deer Lake Avenue and Dale Avenue running from Canada Way to Deer Lake Avenue (see attached sketch), in order to permit a viable use of Heritage Village property.

The Planning Department has been directed to determine if the proposed closure is acceptable to B.C. Hydro, B.C. Telephone, the Engineering and Land Departments, and other organizations that normally participate in a utilities check. If there is an objection, or if a condition such as an easement is required, Council will be notified.

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT Council approve the closure subject to the approval of affected Municipal and non-municipal organizations.
