REMARKS:

There was one armed robbery of a service station where two young men threatened the attendant with a knife and robbed him of approximately \$250.00. No suspects have been located to date and the matter is still being investigated. A Coquitlam citizen reported he was beaten and robbed near the Admiral Hotel by two or three males who jumped on his back and kicked him in the head. He reported his wallet containing \$250.00 and personal papers stolen. This incident is presently under active investigation.

There were two special events in our Community Relations Program that took place during the month. A North West Mounted Police post was established in Heritage Village and is manned by Venturer Scouts dressed in authentic uniforms in honour of the R.C.M.P. Centennial, and the history of policing in Burnaby is portrayed by exhibits in the old City Hall.

The second event was a Detachment Regimental Ball; and we were pleased to welcome among the 1,140 guests, the Mayor and many members of Council and Municipal staff.
