REMARKS:

December was a reasonably quiet month with only two reported robberies. One involved a second-hand store on East Hastings where a female employee was verbally threatened by two men and handed over \$169.00 to them. No weapons were exhibited. The other occurrence involved an 80-year-old woman pedestrian who struggled with a young man when he tried to grab her purse. She retained her purse but suffered injuries to her wrist, ribs and dentures. To date our investigators have been unable to determine the identity of the culprits but investigation is continuing. Our Traffic and General Duty patrols concentrated on drinking drivers over the holiday season with good results, although one fatal accident did occur.
