Following for your information is the report of the Medical Health Officer covering the activities of his Department for the month of January, 1973.

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MONTHLY REPORT

Dear Sir:

I have the pleasure of submitting a report for this Department for the month of January 1973.

In a statistical review of the cancer deaths in Burnaby during 1972, the report shows that there was a total of 179 cancer deaths during the year. The breakdown as to site, is as follows: 34 lung, 11 leukaemia, 17 stomach, 17 bowel, 20 breast, 16 prostate, 5 ovaries, 13 pancreas, 6 rectum, and 3 each bladder, cervix and uterus. There were 31 cases located in other sites. A further breakdown by age group showed that there were none in the birth to 1 year, 1 in the 1 to 4 years, 2 in the 5 to 14 years, none in the 15 to 24 years, 10 in the 25 to 44 years, 68 in the 45 to 64 years, 80 in the 65 to 84 years and 18 in the 85 years and over.

Mrs. Eileen Hubert was appointed to the Public Health Nursing staff replacing Mrs. L. Sutherland who had been on leave of absence, also Mrs. Shirley Young was appointed replacing Mrs. Ann McKay who left the department in December. Mrs. Eileen Hubert obtained her Bachelor of Science of Public Health Nursing Degree from the University of Ottawa and Mrs. Young received her Bachelor of the Science of Nursing degree from the University of British Columbia.

The number of communicable diseases reported during the month of January showed a sizable increase from the previous month, and also the previous year, with a total of 195 cases reported. Of these there were 93 chickenpox, 37 mumps, 17 infectious hepatitis, 9 each impetigo and tuberculosis, 7 scarlet fever, 5 pediculosis, 4 ring-worm and 3 rubella.
