## Re: Medical Health Monthly Report

Following for your information is the report of the Medical Health Officer covering the activities of his Department for the month of September, 1973.

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#### MONTHLY REPORT

Dear Sir:

I have the pleasure of submitting a report for this Department for the month of September 1973.

Miss Lynda Thornton has been appointed Assistant Nursing
Supervisor to the Health Department commencing September 1st. This
has depleted our staff by one field position. Meetings are being
held with the Health Department staff, Victorian Order of Nurses and
Burnaby General Hospital personnel, Meals on Wheels, Homemaker Services
and Provincial Health Department staff in preparation for the new
"Home Care" program. This program will likely commence in the Greater
Metropolitan area in October.

Afternoon pre-natal classes have been discontinued this month due to the popular demand of the evening classes. The popularity of these classes is due to the fact that the husbands can attend with their wives.

The total enrollment in the board schools this September is 27,059 and in the non-board 1,892 making a grand total of 28,951 pupils. These figures show a decrease of 888 from last year at this time in the 62 schools that the Public Health Nurses serve. It must be pointed out at this time that these schools are served by 26 full time Public Health Nurses and 1 part time Public Health Nurse which is a decrease of 1 this year whereas the number of school children served are less, the demands on their services in the school has never been greater. This is due to complex home situations, and their increase in involvement in educational programs particularly in the area of family life. At the same time newer programs are developing such as home care and need for extension of staff rather than curtailment of staff has never been more necessary. It is hoped that this situation will be remedied in the near future.

Two Public Health Inspectors gave two lectures to students in the Hotel/Motel Management course at British Columbia Institute of Technology.

The incidence of communicable disease was higher this month with 61 cases reported. Of these there were 16 gonorrhea, 12 pediculosis, 8 infectious hepatitis and mumps, 4 tuberculosis and salmonella, 2 each whooping cough, chicken pox and measles and 1 each scarlet fever, rubella and ringworm.
