4. Re: Burnaby Mountain Golf Course

During the budget discussions on April 17, 1973, the question was asked as to why we do not have a liquor license at the Golf Course.

The response of the Parks and Recreation Administrator to this question is as follows:

"I have not pressed the question of a liquor license at the Burnaby Mountain Golf Course because of the extremely limited size of the Restaurant facility. During peak periods, this facility is crowded beyond reason and the imposition of a liquor license would probably create sheer chaos. It is true that the facility operates well below capacity most of the time, and during these times the sale of beer or liquor might contribute something to the revenue position. I am personally of the opinion that we should not attempt to sell beer, wine or spirits at the Golf Course until the facility can be enlarged. This of course, will necessitate the construction of a new Pro Shop, and incorporation of the Pro Shop and storage area into the Restaurant. I would anticipate that we might be able to entertain such a project in five to ten years."
