Re: Resident Parking - New Westminster

Alderman Lawson at the Council meeting on April 30, 1973, raised a question regarding special parking permits issued to some residents of New Westminster that gave them special parking rights on that city's streets.

New Westminster authorities have advised that they have two forms of resident parking provisions. In one application, they, like the City of Vancouver, post a "resident parking only" zone. Parking in this zone is free to residents and is enforced upon complaint. The other application is used in areas where there are time limits on parking such as one hour zones, etc. In these areas, the adjacent property owner can purchase an exempt sticker for \$5.00 a year that permits him to exceed the time limit that must be obeyed by other parkers.

The City of New Westminster is able to grant these special concessions to private individuals because it, like the City of Vancouver, holds title to street rights-of-way.
