RE: INSPECTION OF MUNICIPAL CAPITAL ELECTRICAL WORKS.

In accordance with the adopted Council policy the reorganization and reduction of staff in the Contracts Division necessitates retaining the services of a Consulting Engineer to undertake construction inspection of the 1974 Municipal Capital Electrical Works Program.

To this end proposals were invited by letter dated May 13, 1974 (see Attachment "A") from A. W. Pratt, P. Eng., M.E.I.C., Senco Designs Ltd., and R. P. Shaflik Engineering Ltd. who are eminently qualified to provide this service.

In response to this invitation, replies were received by letter (see $\underline{\text{Attachment}}$ "B") as follows:

1. A. W. Pratt, P. Eng., M.E.I.C.

Qualified the invitation by saying "If the projects have been designed by another consultant I would not wish to be inspecting such consultants work."

2. Senco Designs Ltd.

Offered the services of three staff members plus office administration. This would probably be adequate.

3. R. P. Shaflik Engineering Ltd.

Offered services on the basis that "The number and classification of staff personnel, their duties and hours of service would be determined in agreement with the Corporation."

All three proposals indicated that remuneration would be on the basis as laid out in the Outline of Services and Scale of Minimum Fees as published by the Association of Professional Engineers of B. C.

The vast majority of the projects scheduled for construction under the 1974 Electrical Works Program have been designed by R. P. Shaflik Eng. Ltd. and consequently it is felt that this firm would be in the best position to supervise the implementation of their own designs. The Outline of Services and Scale of Minimum Fees booklet allows for a higher rate of remuneration on full time resident engineering services where the design services have been completed by others.

For these reasons plus the fact the proposal by R. P. Shaflik offers the greatest flexibility and control by the Corporation we would recommend that this firm be retained.

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT the services of R. P. Shaflik Engineering Ltd. be retained for inspection of the 1974 Municipal Capital Electrical Works Program in accordance with proposal as outlined above and further stipulated in our letter of May 13, 1974 and R. P. Shaflik Engineering Ltd. letter dated May 29, 1974.

Re: Inspection of Municipal Capital Electrical Works

It is our intention that the construction and installation inspection of our 1974 Municipal Capital Street Lighting Program will be undertaken by Consulting Engineers retained for this purpose.

The proposed 1974 street lighting program consists of approximately 890 units and has an estimated value of \$875,000. A list of the streets proposed for 1974 street lighting installation is attached for your information.

We invite you to submit a proposal for the retention of your organization to provide engineering supervision and construction inspection for the installation of our 1974 street lighting program.

It is expected that your services will be required for the 1973 construction period extending from June to November 1974. Tender documents are currently being prepared for the Willingdon Heights Area No. 1.

Copies of our current contract specifications are available on request.

The services required do not include engineering survey or setting out of the work for construction, which will be undertaken by Municipal forces who will provide all necessary survey to control line, location and grade of the work. Contract documents will be drawn up, tendered and awarded by Municipal staff. Required consultant services include provision of on-site staff to control quality, quantity and rate of progress within the terms of the established contracts.

The Consultant would be responsible to the Municipal Engineer and his staff for the following services:

Provision of office administration of construction, including checking of construction proposals, interpretation of drawings and specifications to the contractor.

Provision of supervisory staff to control construction and rate of progress and inspection of the quality of work performed in compliance with Municipal standards.

General engineering supervision of civil work such as excavation, backfilling and restoration of trenching, tunelling, ducting, pole installations and pole bases, etc. Supervision of assembly and construction of all specified installations such as poles, distribution bases, service panels, junction boxes, etc. Electrical engineering supervision of electrical work to ensure the street lighting system meets the design requirements of surface intensity of illumination including supervision of such work wiring, plumbing of poles, adjustment of refractors and angle of luminaires, etc. Supervision of all ancillary work necessary to prepare the system ready for service connection by B. C. Hydro.

Quality control of materials and equipment to meet Municipal specifications. Material testing will be undertaken by Municipal Testing Consultants on your request.

Installation of all electrical work in accordance with all applicable Municipal codes and regulations.

Control of rate of construction progress in accordance with the contract provisions.

Co-ordination of all aspects of construction and liason between contractors and Municipal staff.

Measurement and computation of quantities of work completed.

Provision and maintenance of construction progress charts, daily diaries, inspectors daily work reports and construction records showing any adjustment or alteration from design drawings in order to assist Municipal staff in the preparation of as constructed plans.

Preparation and certification of interim payment certificates and final completion certificates.

Your proposal should indicate the manner and the rate of reimbursement you would require i.e. payroll plus percentage, percentage of actual cost of construction, or other.

We would appreciate receiving your proposal by 31 May, 1974.

Inspection of Municipal Electrical Capital Works.

Thank you for your letter of May 13.1974 inviting my proposal for consulting services concerning roadway lighting Capital Works within Burnaby.

The situation is not quite clear to me as regards design and inspection of construction, because I notice that there are two projects in the schedule accompanying your letter which were included in the schedule provided March 21,1974 at which time you were inviting proposals for design. I later received your letter of April 11,1974 in which you advised that another proposal for design had been accepted.

If the projects scheduled in your latest letter have been designed by another consultant I would not wish to be inspecting such consultants work as it would violate the code of ethics of the Professional Engineering Association.

However, if the above is not the case, I would be pleased to offer my services for the work as outlined in your letter. Your description is perfectly clear as to what is required.

Regarding your question concerning fee: should I be favoured with this project I would propose charging on the basis of the current schedule of fees, dated May 1972, by the Association of Professional Engineers of British Columbia. This would entail cost plus 125% and in view of the fact that the project would extend over a period of months I would suggest that you be billed monthly for services rendered during the preceeding month.

I trust that you will find this proposal to your satisfaction and would assure you of complete satisfaction should you retain my services.
