REMARKS: The holiday season was marred by two traffic fatalities; in one, a vehicle went off the road on Christmas Day and overturned in a waterfilled ditch. The lone occupant was drowned. The other involved a stolen car which was being driven at a high rate of speed on Rumble Street by a local juvenile. The car went out of control and was practically demolished and an adult passenger was killed. Charges are pending against the juvenile.

Two men have been charged with several offences resulting from their activities involving the armed robbery of the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce at the Lougheed Mall on the 17th December 1973. The bank manager, his wife and children, and the manager's landlord and his children were threatened and held captive by the two heavily armed men. The two men bound the children and left them behind, and took the manager and his wife and landlord to the bank where they further threatened and involved other employees, and robbed the bank of approximately \$125,000.00. As they left the bank with the loot and the manager's wife as hostage, they were overpowered by waiting police who had been alerted. One of the men fired two shots from a sawed-off shotgun, and one of our policemen was wounded slightly in the side and arm. Another had part of his coat shot away, and the manager's wife received minor injuries when struck by ricocheting pellets. All the money was recovered and the hostages were released unharmed.
