COUNCIL MEETING Mar. 18/74

Re: Street Light Improvements on Curtis Street
(Item 17, Report No. 15, February 25, 1974)

On February 25, 1974, Council authorized the upgrading of existing lighting on Curtis Street between Holdom and Sperling Avenues. The B.C. Hydro and Power Authority was subsequently instructed to install leased lighting at the approved rate of \$5.15 per light per month.

The section of Curtis Street from Holdom Avenue to Sperling Avenue which was approved will have to be limited to that section between Holdom and Kensington Avenues as the existing wood poles between Kensington and Sperling Avenue are owned by the B.C. Telephone Company and are unsuited to interim lighting use. Hydro service to this latter section of Curtis Street is provided from the lanes.

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT interim lighting on Curtis be upgraded in accordance with the approval granted by Council on February 25, 1974, subject to the following change:

The work to be limited to that section on Curtis Street between Holdom and Kensington Avenues, and not Holdom and Sperling Avenues as previously authorized.
