REMARKS:

Major crime during October included a homicide at a private residence, wherein a man was found dead from a stab wound. A female resident of the house has been charged with causing his death.

Ten robberies were reported during the month, 3 of them with firearms, 5 with other weapons and 2 by assault. Three attempted armed robberies were thwarted when the victims refused to turn over the money. In one instance, the culprits were arrested by one of our members immediately after leaving the scene and they have since been convicted of this offence. The investigation of a report of a questionable armed robbery resulted in the subsequent arrest of an offender who was found to be responsible for 17 armed robberies in the Lower Mainland area, 3 of them being in Burnaby.

Thefts of motor vehicles continue at a high rate. We are optimistic that our "Stop Auto Theft" program will have an effect on this when the materials are ready for distribution.
