Re: National Roadside Survey 1974

The Foundation of Canada Engineering Corporation Limited in a letter dated April 9, 1974 to the Municipal Engineer advised that Burnaby has been selected for a survey in which some drivers at designated times would be stopped at a checkpoint, asked a series of questions (see attachment) and, upon consent, given a breath test to determine the content of alcohol in their blood.

It has been determined that the purpose of the survey is to obtain information; no charges would be laid against drivers, including those unable to successfully pass the breath analyzer test. Additional details concerning the survey are contained in the following report from the Engineer.



We wish to advise the Council that the Minister of Transport, Traffic and Safety Branch has commissioned Foundation of Canada Engineering Corporation Limited to carry out a survey of drivers across Canada. The principal objective of the survey is to obtain a breath sample in order to establish the level of blood alcohol content of drivers in Canada.

The survey road checks in Burnaby will be conducted on Saturday, April 27 between 10:00 p.m. and 3:00 a.m. the following morning and on Wednesday, May 1 during the same hours.

This office has approved the method of signing and the R.C.M.P. will be in attendance during the full period of the survey.
