

SUBJECT: BURRARD INLET STUDY
PROPOSED TERMS OF REFERENCE

Appearing on the July 22, 1974 Council Agenda will be a letter to Mr. Ward from R. A. Hankin of the G.V.R.D. Planning Department enclosing a copy of the above Terms of Reference.

My only comment is that the study appears to be much narrower than originally proposed by Burnaby as it seems to deal primarily with the issue of oil refinery expansion; rather than a comprehensive study involving all users who have an interest in the Burrard Inlet and its adjacent lands.

It also appears that the decision to proceed with the study, and its final form will be very dependent upon meetings to be held with the B.C. Energy Commission and the National Harbours Board.

I would recommend that we advise the G.V.R.D. that we wish the study to be as comprehensive as possible (i.e. NOT concerned only with refineries); to commence as soon as possible; and that we look forward to participating in the study.
