

Mr. W.P. Wright, Assessment Commissioner of B.C., in his letter to the Mayor and Council of June 11, 1974 indicates that we are in a transitional period when the legislation regarding planned changes in assessment administration is known but many details on how these changes are to be implemented have not yet been decided. During this awkward period he suggests that the arrangements respecting the administration of the assessment function in Burnaby continue as it has in the past and he asks to be advised if this will be agreed to.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Assessment Commissioner be advised that the Mayor and Council will continue to support the Assessment function in Burnaby but would appreciate receiving further information as soon as practical about the many aspects of the proposed changes which will affect the Municipality.
