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Following for your information is the report of the Medical Health Officer covering the activities of his Department for the months of April, May and June, 1974.

Dear sir,

I have the pleasure of submitting the Quarterly Report for the Health Department covering the months, April, May and June 1974.

The "three-year old" clinic which has been in the planning stage for some time commenced operation on April 24, 1974. Owing to the lack of space in the Health Department Offices, arrangements were made to hold this clinic in the Teacher's Professional Library at the Burnaby School Board Offices. The purpose of this clinic is to provide an opportunity to screen children from a health angle at this important age. Each child is examined for hearing, eye test, muscle Imbalance, teeth, speech, growth and development and, nutrition. This clinic offers the mothers an opportunity to discuss their child's learning, through play. Health counselling is available according to the need expressed by the mother. This clinic is proving very popular and appointments are booked for the next four months, and as a result of this response the clinic is now being held twice monthly.

The evening immunization clinic commenced on May 14, 1974 and is held in the health unit offices on the second and fourth Tuesday of each month from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. This clinic appears to be meeting a great need as the clinics are heavily booked by people who are working and are unable to attend the daytime clinics.

The Homecare Service, which has now been operating in Burnaby for over six months, is increasing rapidly as more and more patients are being discharged from the hospitals to this service. The number of patients admitted during the first quarterly year were 114 and in this second quarter 144 were admitted to the service. It is expected with the gradual growth in this program that the services of the half time nurse will soon have to be expanded to full time. The funds for this nurse are provided by the Provincial Government through the Metropolitan Board of Health.

Mrs. Gwenith Bowker, Public Health Nurse, who has been with the Department since 1949, retired in June. Mrs. Bowker has worked in various areas of Burnaby and for the last few years has been the Public Health Nurse in the Maywood School area.

Communicable diseases for this quarter were down from the previous quarter and very much lower from this quarter last year with a total of 204 cases. Of these there were 49 measles, 47 mumps, 32 gonorrhea, 22 pediculosis, 15 infectious hepatitis, 14 chicken pox, 5 scarlet fever, 4 rubella, 2 each whooping cough, scables, tuberculosis, syphilis and 1 diphtheria.
