COUNCIL MEETING Sept. 30/74

Re: Burnaby Civic Employees' Local Union No. 23  
Request to Reopen Agreements Covering the  
Outside Division, Inside Division and Foremen's Division

The attached letter, dated September 11, 1974, has been received from Local 23 of the Burnaby Civic Employees' Union requesting a meeting with the Municipal Negotiating representatives at the earliest possible date to discuss an interim increase of \$50.00 monthly, effective September 1, 1974.

This matter has been considered by the Labour Relations Department of the G.V.R.D. (formerly the M.L.R.B.), which is our Negotiating representative, and it is the recommendation of the Department that the request for a \$50.00 increase should be refused, and that the Labour Relations Department be authorized to formally respond on our behalf (see attached letter dated September 25, 1974 from Mr. Graham Leslie).

Negotiations are presently beginning for the 1975 contract talks.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

THAT the request by the Burnaby Civic Employees' Local Union No. 23 for a \$50.00 interim increase to be effective September 1, 1974, be refused; and

THAT the G.V.R.D. Labour Relations Department, which bargains on our behalf, be asked to formally respond to the Union.


Local 23's presentation will be presented by Bro. A. Burton, C. U. P. E. representative, and our negotiating committee.

SUBJECT: UNION REQUESTS FOR INTERIM 1974 PAY ADJUSTMENT OF \$50.00 PER MONTH

I am writing on the above subject, pursuant to the advice received from your Committee on September 23rd which was endorsed by the Labour Relations Committee of the G.V.R.D. earlier today.

Each of you, therefore, is requested, if and when your jurisdiction receives a request to consider granting an interim pay increase, to present the union request to your Council (or Board or Commission) together with this Department's recommendation that the union request be rejected and that the matter be referred back to this Department in order that the unions may be notified of the decisions of your Councils, Boards and Commissions.

In this regard, a letter was received by this Department from the spokesman for the C.U.P.E. Joint Negotiating Committee earlier today. It contains a request for an early meeting with the "representatives of those employers involved in joint negotiations" in order to discuss the union's request for an interim increase of \$50.00 per month.

I have today replied to the Union, acknowledging the letter and advising that I will be in touch with them in due course to discuss the request for a meeting.

It would be appreciated if any jurisdiction which has already communicated directly with its local union, would nevertheless follow the recommended procedure of referring the matter in question to this Department for the purpose stated in the second paragraph above.
