Dear Sir,

I have pleasure in submitting a report for this Department for the month of December, 1973.

The newly developed Home Care Project is continuing to progress in a very satisfactory way. During the month, Burnaby residents discharged from New Westminster Hospitals were included in the project. In October fourteen patients were admitted to this project, in November twenty-five and December forty-eight patients. Patients and families continue to express complete satisfaction with the Project.


At the request of the Student Community of the Simon Fraser University a new Child Health Centre was established on the Campus being held in the Louis Riel House. This clinic, which will be held once monthly, will be the sixteenth Child Health Centre in the Municipality.

The Community Care consultant has visited twenty-seven Personal Care Facilities, eleven Family Day Care Centres, eleven Group Day Care Centres and sixteen Nurseries. The purpose of these visits is to complete the annual Inspection Report and to meet the operators of these facilities. Improvement in standards of care is an integral part of the consultant's work as well as the actual licensing procedures.

Miss Louise M. Parr retired this month after 20 years service as Public Health Nurse in Burnaby. Miss Parr served in the Vancouver Heights and Capitol Hill areas of Burnaby during her tenure, and became a well known figure to many people in that area.

There was a total of 57 cases of communicable diseases reported during the month which showed a definite decrease over the same time last year and also from the previous month. Of the cases reported there were 18 gonorrhoea, 16 mumps, 4 each of infectious hepatitis, scarlet fever and tuberculosis, 3 each chicken-pox and salmonellosis, 2 each measles and impetigo and 1 meningitis.
