MANAGER'S REPORT NO. 35

Following for the information of Council is a report from the Municipal Treasurer regarding the "SWIM '75" Program.

Basically, all of the applications we made were approved and this will realize a reduction in our Budget of about the same amount as is shown in this report.

Once again, we reiterate that this Program is not as beneficial to this particular Municipality, and municipalities generally, as is STEP. Council will recall that the Municipal Manager was instructed on March 17, 1975 to advise the Minister of Labour of our extreme disappointment that STEP will not be made available to municipalities this year, and to appeal to him to make available to municipalities any unused funds under the Regional District Student Temporary Employment Program. In this respect, attached you will find a copy of a letter dated May 5, 1975 received from Ms. Linda J. Ball, Program Administrator, STEP '75, addressed to the Municipal Manager, which advises that any unused funds under STEP have been redistributed among the Regional Districts in the Province on the basis of unemployment levels and the merit of particular projects.

We do not feel that this answer is satisfactory and we feel that the Mayor should make a personal representation to the Minister of Labour in order to allow the municipalities to gain access to STEP.

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT the Mayor make personal representation to the Minister of Labour to discuss the Student Temporary Employment Program and the need to make it available to Municipalities, rather than just Regional Districts.

On 17 March 1975, Council directed as follows:

"That the Municipal Treasurer, in consultation with department heads, design a program of works to employ up to 64 high school students and 16 university students to carry out the duties of persons ordinarily hired on a temporary basis during the summer months, or in instances where such employment can cut down the use of overtime work of regular staff (as was the case in some instances with the STEP program in 1974); and

That the Municipal Treasurer examine the possibility of utilizing students hired under the subject program on the improvement of the Burnaby trail system network."

Dealing with the last item first, the Parks and Recreation Administrator advised that this project would cost \$13,811.00 in Municipal funds, provision for which was not in the budget. As a consequence, no application was made for this project.


Our original allocation of funds in this program was \$102,700. I gather that the Department of Labour has re-allocated the \$61,724.00 not taken up by Burnaby.

There were a number of other projects submitted by department heads but each and every one of them required an infusion of Municipal funds, provision for which was not in the annual budget.

These programs have been approved by the Department of Labour and the departments concerned and the Personnel Director are in the process of engaging the appropriate staff.

I am corry for the delay in replying to your letter of March 26, 1975 to the Honourable W. S. King, Minister of Labour.

As you are probably aware, a number of changes and improvements have been made in the SWIM programme this year. These changes are a direct result of the suggestions made by municipalities at the conclusion of last years programme.

This year, provision has been made for the hiring of 20% post-secondary students under SWIM to act as supervisors and to allow for projects of longer duration and greater expertise.

Any unused funds under the STTP programme have been redistributed among the Regional Districts in the province on the basis of unemployment levels and the merit of particular projects (exemple, the hiring of disadvantaged student grouns).

I hope that this information has beloed to clarify our position somewhat. If not, I would be glad to answer any further enquiries you may have.
