COMMENTS ON CRIME TRENDS AND POLICING PROBLEMS:

Major offences this month included a shooting murder of two Burnaby women in their residence on Elwell Street; a suspect is in custody charged with this offence.

Of the nine robbery offences three were committed with fire-arms and four with other offensive weapons. In one, two masked men held up a pizza parlour and escaped with money from the till; another was an attempt robbery from the Admiral Hotel by two men armed with shot guns and in the third, two men robbed a service station after tying up the attendant at the point of a gun. There have been three arrests in these latter offences.

Three rapes were reported, one was subsequently proved unfounded and the other two occurred when the culprits entered private residences and forced the victims to submit.

Although B & E offences and theft of motor vehicles are up in total compared to last year at this time, both categories showed reductions in the month of May.
