

Re: BURNABY DOG TAX AND POUND AND ANIMAL REGULATION BY-LAW 1972,
BY-LAW NO. 6191
(Item 7, Report No. 67, October 15, 1974)
(Item 14, Report No. 70, October 28, 1974)

The following is the report of the Treasurer dated November 7, 1975,
regarding the above.

Basically what he is saying is that we must now bring an amendment by-law
forward to effect what was approved on October 15, 1974, which was to
raise the licence fee for unneutered male dogs from \$11.00 to \$21.00
effective January 1, 1976.

The appropriate by-law will be on the Agenda for the November 17, 1975
meeting of Council.

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT the amending by-law be brought forward.

Attached are copies of Item 7, Manager's Report No. 67 to Council of 15
October 1974 and Item 14, Manager's Report No. 70 to Council of 28 October
1974.

On 15 October 1974, Council directed that:

1. effective 1 January 1975, the following schedule of dog licence
fees is to apply:

Unneutered male dog	\$11.00
Neutered male dog	\$ 6.00
Unspayed female dog	\$21.00
Spayed female dog	\$ 6.00

The increase of \$1.00 for each class of licence outlined above is
to be used to cover the cost of putting to death and incinerating
dogs and cats. No special fee is to be charged for this service.

2. effective 1 January 1976, the licence fee for unneutered male dogs
is to be increased to \$21.00.

3. a replacement tag fee of \$1.00 be set.
4. Section 5 of the Burnaby Dog Tax and Pound and Animal Regulation By-law 1972, By-law No. 6191, is to be amended to read "Every owner shall keep his dog on a leash while on a highway or public place."
5. fees for the incineration of other animals and services to veterinarians and approved agencies are to be set at:
 - (a) For each dead body of a horse, mule, ass, cattle, sheep, goat or swine - all costs incurred for removal and disposal plus 10¢ per pound for cremation.
 - (b) For each dead body of any other animal or poultry not covered in Section (a), excluding dogs or cats - \$2.00 plus all special costs of removal and disposal.
 - (c) Veterinarians and other approved agencies:
 - Up to 500 pounds in each calendar month - \$50.00 (10¢ per pound)
 - Up to 1,000 pounds in each calendar month - \$100.00 (10¢ per pound)
 - Plus each additional 500 pounds or part thereof in each calendar month - \$37.50 (7 1/2¢ per pound).
6. the above amendments to the By-law take effect 1 January 1975.

On 28 October 1974, Council directed that:

7. the pound fee of \$10.00 for a licenced dog be increased to \$15.00 and the fee of \$25.00 for an unlicenced dog be increased to \$30.00, plus \$2.00 per day maintenance for all dogs impounded.
8. provision be made in the by-law for a violation notice with respect to failure to keep a dog on a leash while on a highway or public place.
9. the fines set for violations be \$15.00 for a licenced dog and \$30.00 for an unlicenced dog.
10. the maintenance fee of \$2.00 for each horse, mule, ass, cattle, sheep, goat and swine be increased to \$4.00 per day and that a maintenance fee of \$2.00 per day be established for skunks and monkeys.
11. these amendments to the Burnaby Dog Tax and Pound and Animal Regulation By-law 1972, By-law 6191, take effect 1 January 1975.

The directions of Council numbered 1 and 3 to 11 have been put into effect. It is now time to consider putting into effect direction #2, i.e. increase the licence fee for unneutered male dogs to \$21.00 to become effective 1 January 1976.

RECOMMENDATION

1. THAT Burnaby Dog Tax and Pound and Animal Regulation By-law 1972, By-law No. 6191, be amended to increase the licence fee for an unneutered male dog from \$11.00 to \$21.00.
