COMMENTS ON CRIME TRENDS AND POLICING PROBLEMS:

A murder investigation into the shooting death of a male person in his South Burnaby residence is being thoroughly pursued but it does appear to be linked with an underworld killing.

Other serious crimes committed during July included 2 rapes; 1 wounding; and 8 armed robberies.

The recorded motor vehicle fatality during July was actually a June accident when a pedestrian was struck down, seriously injured, and died the following month.
