(Item 14, Report No. 70, October 28, 1974)

Council, at its meeting of October 15, 1974 received Item 7, Report No. 67 which, with other related items, raised the matter of instituting a violation notice and amending the subject bylaw to read "Every owner shall keep his dog on a leash while on a highway or public place." At that meeting Council adopted the foregoing amendment and tabled the matter of a violation ticket and provision of a minimum fine pending receipt of further information.

At its meeting of October 28, 1974, Council received Item 14, Report No. 70 and, with other amendments to the bylaw, provided for fines of \$15.00 for a licenced dog and \$30.00 for an unlicenced dog as regards failure to keep a dog on a leash while on a highway or public place.

Following is the Municipal Treasurer's report, together with a proposed ticket information form.
