REMARKS:

The December major crimes investigated included 8 armed robberies and 2 robberies with violence. One, which involved the case of a 15-year-old juvenile, is still before the courts. An attempted armed robbery involved a youth approximately 12 years old who threatened a gas station attendant with a knife and subsequently fled the scene.

Investigations resulted in the arrest of a juvenile who was responsible for over 40 Breaking and Entries into Burnaby residences and small businesses.

Roadside checkpoints over the festive season involved the checking of over 4,400 vehicles which we feel contributed toward reducing the number of driving offences. One motor vehicle fatality during the early part of December was a single car accident in which the vehicle hit a power pole and the driver was killed.
