COMMENTS ON CRIME TRENDS AND POLICING PROBLEMS:

Major offences during April included an arrest in connection with a reported rape of a 12-year-old girl, an arrest for armed robbery of a taxi driver and theft of the taxi.

Investigations are continuing in connection with four other robberies, which include armed robbery of a bank involving \$2,000.00 and armed robbery of a corner grocery involving \$200.00. A complaint of rape of a 16-year-old girl is also under investigation.

To date this year, assaults is the only category of crime showing a reduction from last year. The number of sexual offences is the same but many other offences show a continuing increase, particularly robbery, B. & E.s and thefts generally, and you will note above, there has been a total of 671 more C.C. offences to the end of April.

The traffic accident picture looks better as far as deaths and injuries are concerned. The increase in property damage accidents could be attributed to the rapidly increasing cost of repairs placing more in the over-\$200 category.
