COMMENTS ON CRIME TRENDS AND POLICING PROBLEMS:

An investigation into the beating death of a woman in her apartment led to the laying of a Murder charge against her son.

There were 12 Robberies reported during June, three of which involved the use of firearms. An elderly couple required medical aid after 3 culprits forced their way into the residence and robbed the couple of \$700.00. An investigation into two attempted robberies within two hours resulted in a 16-year-old youth being brought before the courts.

June was a bad month for serious motor vehicle accidents with 7 traffic fatalities being recorded. A young girl was struck down by a vehicle which fled the scene, but with the assistance of the news media an arrest later resulted. A vehicle which went out of control on Royal Oak resulted in the death of the driver and lone passenger; a speeding stolen vehicle went out of control and killed a pedestrian; 2 persons were killed when 2 vehicles collided at an intersection; and another driver was killed when his vehicle struck a power pole.
