

Re: By-Law 6616, Burnaby Pool Room Regulation By-Law 1975
(Item 4, Report No. 82, December 9, 1974)
(Item 1, Report No. 5, January 27, 1975)
(Item 20, Report No. 17, March 10, 1975)

Further to item number 17, Council at its meeting of March 10, 1975 asked that we give some indication of the place of residence of people making use of Jubilee Billiards. In item 17 we noted that there was little doubt in our minds that Jubilee Billiards was serving customers from well beyond Burnaby's boundaries and that we were presently trying to verify this fact.

Since March 12, the R.C.M.P. have conducted periodic checks of persons entering or leaving the hall and so far they have checked ~~96~~⁸⁸ persons. ²³ ~~24~~ were Burnaby residents and 65 were from outside points.

Of 15 persons checked from 10:00 p.m. to 2:00 a.m., about 8 were Burnaby residents. After 2:00 a.m., there were 81 checked and 23 were Burnaby residents.

The records show that between November, 1973 and January, 1974 there were 15 charges laid that originated from sources of information the R.C.M.P. had established at Jubilee Billiards. Of the 15 charges, 6 were against Burnaby residents and 9 were against residents from outside points (Port Moody, New Westminster, Vancouver).
