## RE: 1976 PARKS REFERENDUM BY-LAW

Council, at its meeting of August 30, 1976, approved the attached Supplementary Item 26, Manager's Report No. 54, which established the Parks' portion of a combined By-Law at \$7,767,000; and requested that the Commission provide a new project budget.

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Staff recommends the attached program, marked Appendix "A". This program is comprised of:

The amount to be allocated to these three park sites is the remaining \$163,169 of the Referendum funds. Staff will be refining this amount by identifying specific items on each park site.

It should be noted that there is a possibility of N.I.P. funds for Mary Avenue and Ernie Winch Parks.

The Municipal Treasurer has indicated that, if the Commission approves a program and provides the information to him on Thursday, September 9th, 1976, there will be sufficient time left for the Municipal Clerk to process the required by-laws.

## Re: PROPOSED 1976 REFERENDUM

Following is a report from the Municipal Treasurer dated August 30, 1976 dealing with the proposed 1976 Referendum.

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The purpose of this report is to basically advise the three sectors involved of the amount of funds that will be available for project allocation when the by-law passes, and to obtain from the Parks and Recreation Commission and the Library Board a new detailed project budget for each.

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

- 1. THAT the composite by-law total be set at \$23,000,000 and be composed of the sums shown above; and
- 2. THAT the project allocations of \$8,933,000 for the Kensington overpass project, \$5,631,000 for the Library projects, and \$7,767,000 for the Parks and Recreation projects be established and that the Library Board and the Parks and Recreation Commission be so advised; and
- 3. THAT the Library Board and the Parks and Recreation Commission be asked to submit new project budgets in the totals shown, and that they do so expeditiously.

RE: PROPOSED 1976 REFERENDUM

At a special meeting of Council on 23 August 1976 a resolution of Council passed on 3 August 1976 was amended to read:

"THAT the Kensington overpash project, the Library projects, and the Parks and Recreation projects go forward as a composite loan authorization by-law; the Kensington overpass project for two years in the amount of \$9,200,000, the Library for two years in the amount of \$5,800,000, and the Parks and Recreation projects for three years in the amount of \$8,000,000 for a total of \$23,000.000."

To determine the allocations for construction purposes, it is necessary to deduct from each of the figures shown, provision for discount and expenses on the sale of securities, as follows:

The project allocation for the Kensington overpass project is \$282,300 less than the latest available construction cost estimate, and the allocation for libraries is \$53,089 less than shown in the Library Board's letter of request of 9 August 1976 for the headquarters building and the Cameron site acquisition. The project allocation for Parks and Recreation is \$1,168,196 less than the first three years of the \$11,133,000 program submitted by the Commission to Council.

None of the prospective grants for these projects have been firmed up. Some will likely be forthcoming, sufficient at least to defray the estimated shortfall in the Kensington project. Under the circumstances, it is:

### RECOMMENDED

- 1. THAT the composite by-law total be set at \$23,000,000 and be composed of the sums shown above; and
- 2. THAT the project allocations of \$8,933,000 for the Kensington overpass project, \$5,631,000 for the Library projects, and \$7,767,000 for the Parks and Recreation projects be established and that the Library Board and the Parks & Recreation Commission be so addised; and
- 3. THAT the Library Board and the Parks & Recreation Commission be asked to submit new project budgets in the totals shown, and that they do so expeditiously.
