Appearing on last week's agenda was a letter from Mr. David H. Vickers, Deputy Attorney-General, regarding the collection of fines related to contraventions of Municipal By-Laws. Following is a report from the Municipal Treasurer on this matter.

On 12 April 1976 Council received a letter from David H. Vickers, Deputy Attorney-General, which stated in effect: "In particular, we will no longer collect and remit fines owing to municipalities where a ticket or notice has been issued and where no information has been sworn and no summons issued."

Most of these are parking tickets; roughiy, 1,000 per month. Many of these are not paid by the prescribed date and a complex collection action muat take place. The Attorney-General is saying that in the first instance, the Province will not collect the fine; and in the second, will not follow it up if unpaid. He is also saying that in instances where a Judge givea time to pay on by-law offences, the Province wil. 1 not follow up if the fine continues to be unpald.

This problem requires thorough exanination and the formulation of a solution.
