## Re: SIGN BY-LAW

Mr. Fraser Wilson appeared before Council in September 13, 1976 for the purpose of presenting a brief on Burnaby sign by-law No. 6163 and 6472. Council requested Mayor Constable to strike a committee of Council to meet with the effected parties to review the existing by-laws and report back to Council on this matter. The information that Council requested relative to the number of applications that have been received for signs is contained in the following report from the Director of Planning.

REVIEW OF SIGN BYLAW WITH REGARD TO DELEGATION OF SIGN MANUFACTURERS

At the meeting of September 13, 1976 Council received a delegation from a group of sign manufacturers with Mr. Fraser Wilson as their spokesman opposing the existing adopted Sign Bylaws.

In light of the delegation's presentation and subsequent discussion of Council, it was determined that the Mayor would appoint a Committee to review the Sign Bylaw. It would be expected that the delegation's submission would be discussed in detail and that staff comment would be requested within the context of this established Committee.

Council also requested information as to the number of sign applications received in recent years and whether there is any fee for any sign permits.

The numbers of sign applications received in recent years is:

Year	Number of Applications
1973	173
1974	180
1975	190
1976	120 (up to September 14)

Of these sign applications which we have recorded, approximately 90% were approved. The remainder were either abandoned by the applicant or rejected for non-compliance with the Sign Bylaw. Each application may cover more than one individual sign, such as a comprehensive sign plan for all signs within a small commercial complex.

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The Planning Department does not levy a fee for the processing of sign applications. However, the Building Department levies fees based on an electrical permit fee of \$7.50 per sign connection and a building permit fee determined by the value of the proposed sign (see attached schedule).
