Re: TENDERS FOR CONTAINERS
(ITEM 19, REPORT NO. 64, OCTOBER 12, 1976)

Following is a report from the Purchasing Agent regarding tenders for refuse containers.

The proposal as outlined in the report would, if adopted, increase the number of four cubic yard containers that are required for refuse collection services to strata title developments. This proposal is based on a recently concluded survey by the Engineering Department which shows that all future strata title units that are to become occupied in the near future would prefer four cubic yard containers, and some of the larger existing developments are now in the process of changing their container housing facilities to accept and store containers of this size. The three cubic yard containers which we originally thought would be required in greater abundance should therefore be reduced accordingly.

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT the Purchasing Agent's recommendations be adopted.

The Council on October 12, 1976 accepted the tender of Yarrows Ltd., \$64,713.60 including all applicable taxes for the manufacture and delivery of 140 - 3 cubic yard containers and 80 - 4 cubic yard containers and that in the event that additional containers are required within 90 days, 50 - 3 cubic yard containers and 30 - 4 cubic yard containers to be manufactured and delivered for the sum of \$23,540.00 including all applicable taxes.

The Engineering Department staff have recently completed an up-to-date survey. This review indicates very clearly that additional 4 cubic yard containers are required and fewer 3 cubic yard containers.

Yarrows Ltd. are prepared to delete 50 - 3 cubic yard containers from the contract and increase the total number of 4 cubic yard containers from 110 to 200 at the price tendered, \$280.00 plus 7% provincial tax per container.

Funds are available in 1976 Capital Budget for the additional containers.

The Municipal Engineer and the Purchasing Agent recommend.

RECOMMENDATION

THAT 50 - 3 cubic yard containers valued at \$13,600.00 plus 7% provincial tax be deleted from the contract, and

THAT a purchase order be issued subject to the terms and conditions of the contract, increasing the number of 4 cubic yard containers ordered by 90, costing \$25,200.00 plus 7% provincial tax.
