MINUTES

The Minutes of the Council Meeting held on November 22, 1976 came forward for adoption.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN AST: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN RANDALL:

"THAT the Minutes of the Council Meeting held on November 22, 1976 be now adopted."

Alderman Gunn advised that the Resolution at the bottom of page 3 in regard to a low cost option relative to the CNR/Burlington Northern overpass in the vicinity of Sperling Avenue should be amended to read "a low cost 2 lane option relative to the CNR/Burlington Northern overpass in the vicinity of Sperling Avenue'.

A vote was then taken on the on the motion as amended and CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

a) Mrs. Vick, Burnaby Citizens Roads Committee

Mrs. Lucy Vick appeared before Council and spoke as follows:

"Many groups, -- our own included -- Burnaby Citizen's Roads Committee -- are formed when people feel they are being led down the garden path or worse yet --

not even being considered in the plans underway that would affect their families and their homes.

I believe the first thing that happens when people hear of such plans -- be it a truck route -- overpass or blockade -- is one of disbelief -- "How come this is going on when we haven't even heard of it" or "What are you talking about -- that was voted down -- or shelved or whatever."

We then form groups and get into the area of communicating with our officials -- elected and staff.

Everyone is very polite -- staff gives you everything you ask for -- exactly. Not the page behind or ahead -- and you find out later that's what you needed so back you march to the Municipal Hall. You buy maps etc. that you think you need and later on find out about a program called P.I.P. These initials stand for Public Information Program -- the cost is \$25.00 and this includes the maps etc. -- the ones you have already purchased. The layperson can go around in circles trying to ferrett out information to get points for his cause.

I have asked -- this past week over fifty adults in Burnaby, if they knew what P.I.P. stood for. I received some hilarious answers, but not one correct one.

I then asked if they knew anything about the Public Information Program. The answers ranged from "Whose?" to "Yeah -- that's the stuff you get in with your family allowance cheques." You will be happy to know there are now fifty people who have been informed of this P.I.P. program at no expense to the Municipality.

We get involved in conversations with Council Members -- We hear the words: INPUT -- ALTERNATIVES -- G.V.R.D. -- PRIORITIES -- BUYER BEWARE -- and the old crutch -- ARE YOU AGAINST PROGRESS?

We are told "Yes -- we can do this or that -- but we can promise nothing because we cannot speak for the next Council -- if there is any change."

May I suggest to you, in that case one Council's priorities may be the next Council's poison. Council can change every two years but Burnaby homeowners tend to stay longer and their homes are their priorities.

Buyer Beware is an established cliche, but if the buyer does everything required of him and buys property fully aware of all plans for his area and agrees with them — those plans can be changed in one or two Council meetings — a new bylaw — a rezoning — days, weeks, months, or years after he bought his property in good faith; and if he doesn't attend Council meetings or read the legal notices in the papers, he too will be forming a group.

We also reach the point as time goes by of gaining more knowledge and of seeing many more problem areas in Burnaby and throughout it -- all we hear -- "I didn"t know".

Lack of information between the people running Burnaby and the citizens of Burnaby. I spoke to this in my brief presented at the Public Meeting, November 3, 1976, on the Boundary Road Issue.

The other night in the Vancouver Sun, under the byline of Harvey Oberfeld, Sun Regional Affairs reporter, was the story headed — "Consult ordinary people more — G.V.R.D. tells planners" and I quote, "Greater Vancouver Regional District Planners were ordered to-day to spend less time consulting professional citizens and get out to meet and talk with ordinary citizens. Mayor Constable — the article goes on to say — agreed the district has been falling down on communicating to residents about not only the livable region program but also the G.V.R.D. itself.

On election night, November 20, 1976, I watched Channel 10 with host Bob Anderson and Alderman Lawson. During that telecast, Bob Anderson told Alderman Lawson that Channel 10 was a public information source and was available for use as such and it was up to Burnaby how they used it.

I have followed this up with a phone call to Mr. David Liddell, Station Manager at Channel 10. I repeated to him what I had heard on Election night and asked him just what this meant. He told me that near the end of January —"Burnaby Cable 10", although the Channel may be designated another number will be established. This is mobile equipment and able to go anywhere in Burnaby.

My question to Mr. Liddell poured out, "Can Council Meeting reports -- Public Meetings -- Public Hearings -- Bylaws -- Rezonings -- Road Works -- plans for the future of Burnaby and many more be announced by this media? He said, "YES." I understood Mr. Liddell to say this could come under what would be known as "Neighbourhood Television Project."

I am sure that Council would like this information problem resolved. If every person in Burnaby were told that he could find out what is going on in the Council Chambers of his Municipality by turning the dial to a certain number; at a certain time on a certain day; the onus would then be on the citizen. All Council has to do is follow this through and then notify their citizens. This brief is intended to be input and also an alternative to NO INFORMATION.

b) Mr. N. E. Noble Re: Lease of Noble Towing Ltd. at old Kapoor Sawmill site.

Mr. Noble appeared before Council and spoke to the following correspondence:

"This letter is being written to you by Nova Lumber Co. Ltd. because of its relationship to Noble Towing Co. and F. & N.Log Sorting Co. Ltd.

F. & N. Log Sorting Co. Ltd. carries on work under a sub lease from Noble Towing Co. at the old Kapoor Sawmill site. The work performed is generally the booming and sorting of logs delivered by barge and flat rafts. This work is vital as a source of supply of suitable logs for our sawmill, both in direct supply of cedar and also, logs used for trading purposes.

Nova Lumber Co. Ltd. is a swamill of 120 employees, specializing in cedar products, located one mile east of the Second Narrows Bridge in the District of North Vancouver.

As we are all aware, the Corporation of Burnaby expropriated the Kapoor property in mid 1974 and in 1975 the Council has expressed the wish that the log sorting company vacate the premises.

Since that time, I have been in search for a suitable place to re-locate.

After long negotiations, we thought we had a place to move to at Admirality-Point. The Harbours Board granted a lease in that area, but due to a ship anchorage site to the west, we were prohibited by the Harbours Board to use this area for sorting of logs. Therefore, the long period of time in which we anticipated success, was for nothing.

In the meantime, we acquired a site to the west for the purpose of sorting logs. This area is on both sides of the Shell Oil Dock. The east side to be used for sorting and the west side for dumping and holding bag booms.

Due to the long construction strike, we were unable to perform any work in the area preparatory to the establishment of a sorting grounds until late October, 1976.

Prior to this, we had relied on an atlas of Tidal Current charts for Vancouver harbour to determine flow rates and direction for the area. These seemed O.K. When we began construction at the site, it became obvious the currents in this area were much stronger than indicated on the charts and sorting of logs there would be very difficult, if not near impossible.

We have also been negotiating with the Harbours Board for a site near the north end of Indian Arm. The Harbours Board is anxious to grant us a lease in this ideal location but the area is presently held by lease to a

logging company. No activity has gone on there for the past 3 years and their lease expires in the Spring of 1977. I have been in touch with these people and the Harbours Board, and we will undoubtably have a place to relocate at this site.

I realise time has dragged on and on. We are anxious to relocate, but circumstances have been against us. We have an ideal site to move to at the head of Indian Arm, but due to reasons stated in the previous paragraph, we are unable to use it for some time. I therefore respectfully request that Council grant us an extension until June 30th, 1977. If required, we would be willing to post a bond to guarantee our vacating the premise on time."

R. Bennett and his cabinet to discuss the question of signing the lease documentation on the Oakalla Lands for Parks purposes.

On a further question of Alderman Stusiak, Mayor Constable advised that he would be attending in Ottawa on December 15th approximately to discuss the question of the George Derby Lands with the Honourable Barney Danson, Minister of Urban Affairs.

a) Mayor T. W. Constable Re: Council Meeting Tuesday, December 28, 1976

Mayor Constable noted the regular meeting of December 27th would be deferred to December 28th due to staff holidays on Monday, December 27th. It was recommended that the Council meeting to be held December 28th, 1976 be cancelled.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN STUSIAK: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN LAWSON:

The Municipal Manager reported as follows:

"The Mayor in his report which appears on the agenda recommends that the meeting of Council on December 28, 1976 be cancelled. The purpose of this report is to augment the information contained in the Mayor's report so that Council is made aware of the procedure that is normally followed when meetings are cancelled during the holiday season.

Related to the suspension of year end regular meetings is the custom of not considering business matters at a statutory meeting of Council which next year will be on January 3 (as required by Section 159 of the Municipal Act.) The procedure that has been followed during the moratorium has been to give authority to the Mayor to call special meetings as may be required for the conduct of urgent or special business that may arise during this time.

Following are the dates on which Council would definitely convene for the purpose of conducting business during the period in question if the recommendation to cancel the meeting on December 28 is adopted:

If a meeting is required between these dates, a notification will be sent to all concerned. Although it is anticipated that no meeting will be required during this period of time, we want Council to be aware of the fact that the possibility exists.

2) Tenders for 2 Heavy Duty Single Axle Trucks C/W 5 - 7 Cubic Yard Dump Boxes.

The Municipal Manager provided a report from the Purchasing Agent regarding tenders for trucks with dump boxes.

The Municipal Manager provided a report from the Director of Planning regarding proposed amendments to the Burnaby Mountain Conservation and Eastern Burnard Inlet Foreshore Areas.

It was recommended that:
