COMMENTS ON CRIME TRENDS AND POLICING PROBLEMS:

A murder investigation which continued since January produced successful results with the arrest of 3 suspects. Additional charges were also laid in connection with 2 major armed robberies of a local lumber outlet. Six other robberies, two involving use of firearms, continue under investigation.

Two reports of rape continue under investigation. Charges were laid in connection with reports of indecent assaults near schools.

The clearance rate shows encouraging results, as does the reduction of traffic accidents, etc. over the same period a year ago.

Overtime:

Total hours for June - 614.5 (paid at time and one-half). Of this total, 338.5 hours were for attending court whilst off duty, leaving 276 controllable time. Please note June does not have a statutory holiday, therefore this results in approx. 1,000 hrs. reduction compared to a month with a stat. holiday. June monthly average is approx. 1.5 hrs. per man.
