Tenders for the subject project were received up to 3:00 p.m. local time on the 29th day of June 1976.

The work includes the supply and installation of road construction materials on sundry streets in Burnaby.

Approximate quantities involved are as follows:

10,700 lin. ft. of 5' P.C. curb sidewalks  
13,500 lin. ft. of P.C. concrete curb and gutter  
3,500 lin. ft. of 4' and 5' sidewalks  
12,000 lin. ft. of 28', 36' and 46' pavement

The Corporation will make an equitable adjustment to contract unit prices where the asphalt work is affected by the following defined energy related material changes in price.

During the contract term, the Contractor shall advise the Engineer in writing of any changes in the manufacturer's posted published prices, including Federal Excise Tax. The unit prices of asphaltic concrete mix shall be adjusted for payment purposes using the following proportions as a basis of calculation:

124

- Liquid Asphalt - 6% liquid asphalt by weight
- Heating Oil - 3 Imperial gallons per ton of asphaltic mix supplied.
- Natural Gas - Five Therms per ton of asphaltic concrete mix supplied.
- Propane, Butane - Six Imperial gallons per ton of asphaltic concrete mix supplied.

The Contractor shall list with his tender the posted prices, rates or tariffs of each of the above materials together with a list showing his plants to be used and the materials used at each plant.

Changes in costs of other energy sources such as electricity, gasoline, lube oil, diesel fuel for trucks shall be allowed for in the Contractor's unit prices and shall not be paid for by the Corporation.

Six tenders were received and opened in the presence of Messrs. Hagen, Constable, Sinclair, Kennedy and representatives of the firms bidding.

A tabulation of the tenders received is attached.


All work under this contract shall be completed within sixty (60) consecutive working days after commencement of construction.

The Engineer's estimate was \$59,880.00

The Municipal Engineer and the Purchasing Agent concur with the following recommendation.

RECOMMENDATION

THAT the lowest tender submitted by Jack Cewe for the sum of \$574,881.00 be accepted with final payment to be based on actual quantities and the unit prices tendered.
