**COMMENTS ON CRIME TRENDS AND POLICING PROBLEMS:**

The month of May recorded our 1st traffic fatality. This resulted from a two-car accident, in which the driver later died in hospital, and charges being laid against driver of other vehicle.

Our traffic statistics for persons injured; property damage; and total accidents are down considerably compared to May of 1975 and are down in all categories over the same period last year. Hopefully of course that trend continues.

Major occurrences included 4 armed robberies, with use of firearms. Arrests were made in one - remainder continue under investigation. Four other robberies, still under investigation, include robbery from a taxi driver, purse snatching from an elderly lady.

Re: Overtime-Total hrs. for May-2382 (These are actual hrs. paid at time and a half). Of these hrs., 916 hrs. was compensation for Statutory Holiday and 350.5 for attending Court on days off. This then leaves our controllable overtime at 1115.5 hrs. for an average of slightly less than 6 hrs. per man for the 191 contract strength. Several special operations during April & May consumed a good percentage of the overtime and I am looking forward to being able to log lesser extra hours and still meet operational commitments.
