SUBJECT: S.P.C.A. SPAY AND NEUTER CLINIC

Council, on 8 December 1975, received Item 15, Manager's report no. 79, 1975 and adopted the following recommendations:

- 1. THAT a one-time grant of \$17,500 be approved to the S.P.C.A. for construction of a low cost spaying and neutering clinic on their property at 1205 East 7th Avenue, Vancouver; and
- 2. THAT payment of the grant be made to the S.P.C.A. on the awarding of a contract for construction of the clinic building.

On 9 August 1976, the S.P.C.A. opened a low cost spay and neuter clinic at 1205 East 7th Avenue, Vancouver.

In the attached letter, Mr. C. Jack Homes, Secretary-Manager of the Vancouver Regional Branch, B.C.S.P.C.A., advises the number of surgical sterilizations performed on animals owned by Burnaby residents between the opening date and 31 December 1976, and the total number of sterilizations to date. Also attached is the first report on the operation of the clinic. Use of the clinic by Burnaby residents is 14.59% of the 4,111 sterilizations performed to 31 December 1976. For the same period, use by Vancouver residents is 40.12%. Sufficient copies of the report are available for inclusion with Council members' agendas.


The increasing number of neutered and spayed licences indicates that dog owners are accepting the rationale for sterilization of their pets, particularly owners of male dogs.
