Reference: the submission of Dr. Hill dated October 28, 1977.

The recent single vehicle accident in the 5600 block Buckingham Avenue which claimed the lives of two teenagers was indeed a tragedy and we most certainly sympathize with the concerns of the many citizens who have contacted us requesting that something be done to curb the increasing problem of speeding. We do not feel however that the placing of stop signs along streets used by speeders is the solution to this problem, in fact it could lead to an increase in the disrespect so many motorists now show for existing traffic control devices and regulations. If traffic control devices are to function they must at least have credibility in the eyes of the motorists. In reviewing the circumstances that led to the subject accident one has to question whether the driver, who was a local resident and no doubt very familiar with the street and its traffic patterns, would have been detered by the placement of unwarranted stop signs.

In discussions with the R.C.M.P., we were advised that this problem of speeding, particularly during the evening and early morning hours is not confined to this area of Burnaby but is general throughout the Municipality. They have however indicated that they will increase their surveillance along the Buckingham route.

As the members of Council are aware the subject of traffic on Buckingham Avenue, particularly as it relates to its use by commutors, is presently under study. It is our intention in the very near future to hold a public meeting with the residents of that area bounded by Canada Way, Sperling Avenue and Burris Street to discuss their concerns and what changes can be introduced into the traffic patterns within their area.
