Re: 1977 PROVINCIAL YOUTH EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM  
(ITEM 17, SUPPLEMENTARY REPORT NO. 21, MARCH 21, 1977)

Following is a report from the Municipal Treasurer on the proposed submission of an application for the undertaking of a project under the Provincial Youth Employment Program.

Although there are several diversion-oriented shoplifting films on the market to-day, none have a suitable combination of impact and information while maintaining credibility, particularly with respect to students who are 13 to 16 years of age. The Officer-in-Charge believes that the content and production methods that have been proposed by the students are impressive, and that their film would be of considerable assistance to the detachment as a teaching aid in the school program.

The students have produced films for their Business Management course at B.C.I.T. and have extensively pursued this type of activity as a hobby for several years. Judging from the work that they have done, it is apparent that they have the required ability and only need suitable equipment to produce a quality work.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. THAT the work program as outlined in the Municipal Treasurer's report be approved; and
2. THAT the Municipal Treasurer be instructed to forward the application to Victoria.

The R.C.M.P. recommend that two B.C.I.T. students be employed to produce a crime prevention film on juvenile shoplifting, and film inserts for the school curriculum unit project on the criminal justice system. An extension of the deadline for submission of applications is expected to be received from the Ministry of Labour for this project.

The filming equipment, as well as the store premises, are being supplied by Simpsons-Sears Ltd. The film materials will be covered by Legal Services Commission sponsorship. Both students have access to B.C.I.T. for film editing equipment, C.B.C. for costumes, and a drama club for actors.

The students are to be employed from 4 July to 26 August 1977 inclusive.

A grant in the amount of \$1,872.00 is expected to be received from the Province, against which Burnaby's cost will approximate \$3,122.00. The difference of \$1,250.00 will be financed out of the R.C.M.P. crime prevention program budget.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. THAT the work program as submitted be approved; and
2. THAT the Municipal Treasurer be instructed to forward the application to Victoria.
