At its meeting of the 18th of May, 1977, the Parks and Recreation Commission received the following report on the above program:

"The Eastburn Residents Community Association, on behalf of the Neighbourhood Improvement Program, has successfully applied for a Young Canada Works Program grant for the following projects:

- Construction of creative playground equipment and signs, and installation on tot lots and parks in the NIP area.
- 2. The clean-up and beautification of Stride Ravine.


"The program will involve the employment by the Citizens' Committee of ten (10) students for a 14-week period commencing May 30, 1977. The Union has stated that it has no objections to the students performing work on Municipal property at the rates of pay provided through the Government grant.

"Parks staff would work closely with the Citizens' Committee and the Young Canada Works employees, including on the job supervision to ensure that all design and work met Municipal standards. Both projects are part of the existing NIP work program and can now be achieved through this additional Government funding, thus increasing the scope of work to which regular NIP funds can be put.

"Stride Ravine clean-up will consist of the removal of debris, clearing of some under growth and broken trees, and constructing of trails. The creative play equipment will be installed in conjunction with existing play equipment and at other strategic locations as appropriate.
