SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF WATERLOT LEASE FRONTING BLOCK 4,

D.L. 214 — BURRARD INLET MARINE PARK

The Corporation has submitted an application to the National Harbours Board to lease the subject waterlot for public recreational use. This waterlot is located west of the Texaco Tank Farm as illustrated on the attached sketch. The Burrard Inlet Development Plan proposes that portions of this waterlot be reclaimed and a foreshore walkway be constructed together with a sand beach and a small craft centre.

The National Harbours Board approved the granting of a lease under the following terms and conditions:

TERM:

Twenty-one (21) years commencing July 1, 1976 and terminating June 30, 1997.

RENTAL:

For the period July 1, 1976 to June 30, 1979: \$200.00 per annum (1)

(2)

For each respective three-year period thereafter rental shall be payable at such respective revised rate as may be fixed by the Board pursuant to subclause B of the

Interpretation clause.

PURPOSE:

The construction, operation and maintenance by the Lessee--as a municipally operated project -- of recreational facilities for the benefit of the general public. It is expressly agreed that recreational facilities do not include commercial or quasi-commercial activities from which revenue is derived for profit.

This lease has been negotiated to reflect the National Harbours Board policy of establishing a lease rate which reflects the ultimate use or purpose for the waterlot. The lease rate has, therefore, been established at a nominal rate in recognition of the public recreational use of the subject waterlot.

RECOMMENDATION

THAT the Parks and Recreation Commission recommend to the Municipal Council that the subject lease agreement be executed.
