## BACKGROUND

Council will recall that on February 21, 1977 a motion was passed which provided the authority for the staff to initiate the closure of the subject road allowance as illustrated on the attached Sketch #1 and to obtain title to the closed allowance.

The Planning Department subsequently wrote to the various public agencies and other Municipal departments to initiate the implementation of the proposed closure. The B.C. Ministry of Highways and Public Works advised that this section of the Barnet Highway is currently under study with a view towards multi-laning. However, to date they have not been able to start the design and, therefore, they were not able to consent to the closure until such time as their right-of-way requirements could be determined with reasonable accuracy.

The Planning Department requested the Ministry to review their requirements in the immediate area on a priority basis. It was further proposed that if their time constraints were such that this was not possible, perhaps we could initiate a closure which involved a minimum amount of right-of-way as illustrated on the attached Sketch #2.

#### CURRENT SITUATION

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The Ministry of Highways advised that they do not foresee any problems with the closure of this right-of-way as shown on Sketch #2 providing the Municipality provides the assurance that they will grant any required construction or drainage easements as may be necessary for the construction of the proposed new road.

#### RECOMMENDATION

# It is recommended:





NORTH OF BARNETHWY REF# 5/77




ROAD CLOSURE AS
