COMMENTS ON CRIME TRENDS AND POLICING PROBLEMS:

Major incidents during the month of August included an Attempted Murder of a man during a dispute with five others. The five assailants have been charged and are presently before the courts.

Two reports of rape were received during the month. Investigation confirmed one was unfounded; the other still remains under investigation.

A man and his wife were arrested and are presently before the courts after investigation into a reported robbery of a service station. In another armed robbery incident where a local bank was robbed, an arrest was made and the person is presently before the courts. Investigations continue into two other robberies during the month.

Escapes during the month numbered 11.

Re: MONTHLY REPORT - MUNICIPAL POLICING

We wish to identify that the figures under "Revenue" representing Municipal fines have, in the past, referred only to revenue turned over by the Provincial Court Clerk, as Municipal revenue. Therefore, beginning with this month the total includes the combined revenue of Parking Ticket fines paid to our Cashier and the amount collected through the Provincial Clerk.

For information purposes, the combined totals back to January 1st, 1977, are as follows:

In the past, we have also included the total revenue collected Provincially and Federally each month. This information would not appear to have any direct relationship to a Municipal Policing Return; and since we need to obtain it from the Provincial Clerk each month, I propose to discontinue relating those figures unless advised to the contrary.

NOTE:

Fines are paid in one of two ways:

1. To the Provincial Court Clerk if the violator waits until after he or she has received a summons that payment is delinquent, or if a fine is imposed as the result of an appearance in Court.
2. To the cashier in the R.C.M.P.'s Traffic Division when a ticket is not contested and is paid without the need for issuance of a summons.
