Re: LETTER FROM MR. W. WONG-MOON, PRESIDENT, COSMOS CLUB, WHICH APPEARED ON THE AGENDA FOR THE OCTOBER 24, 1977 MEETING OF COUNCIL (ITEM 2(b)) APPLICATION FOR AN "A" LOUNGE LICENCE  
7834 - 6th STREET, BURNABY, B. C.

Appearing on last week's agenda was a letter from Mr. W. Wong-Moon, President, Cosmos Club, regarding an application for an "A" Lounge Licence. Mr. Ronald Rogers, a spokesman for the club, also appeared as a delegation. Council's deliberation of the information presented resulted in adoption of the following resolution:

"THAT, subject to the full compliance by the Cosmos Club with all municipal regulations and requirements, this Council strongly support the application of the Cosmos Club to the Liquor Control and Licensing Branch for a Class "A" Liquor Licence for its premises at 7834 Sixth Street."



This has reference to correspondence with the Cosmos Club regarding their application for a Class A liquor licence at 7834 - 6th Street.

On 6 September 1977, a meeting was held with the Chief Licence Inspector, Senior Licence Inspector and four directors of the Cosmos Club. The topic of the meeting was the club's application for a Class A liquor licence with the Provincial Government Liquor Administration Branch. At this time, it was pointed out by Mr. Kenzie that the club had complied with all the requirements of the Municipality, however as a non-profit organization, a municipal licence would not be required. Therefore, a Class A licence would have to be issued by the Provincial Government and the applicants should accordingly contact the appropriate Provincial Government authority.

As of 24 October 1977, the Chief Licence Inspector has not had any further contact with the Cosmos Club.
