d) Greater Vancouver Regional District, Chairman, G.V.R.D. Transportation Committee Re: Proposals for Regional Transportation Organization and Financing

Correspondence under date of January 24, 1977 was received in regard to the above noted subject and indicating that the Transportation Committee is of the opinion that a proposed Province-wide Transit Authority for the purpose of dealing only with transit deficits was inappropriate to deal with the very complicated affairs in regard to transportation in the Greater Vancouver area. It was indicated they

hoped to be able to convince the Provincial Government to establish a separate entity for Greater Vancouver and if that agreement is reached they would then sit down again with the area Councils and with the Provincial Government to try and work out an acceptable financial formula. In the meantime, they would be pleased to receive any detailed comments Council may have on financial proposals.

The Municipal Manager provided a report from the Director of Planning on this matter.

It was recommended by the Municipal Manager that:

- council support the proposal that a joint study of light rapid transit be carried out in 1977 in order to test the physical and economic feasibility of such a system in the lower mainland and that the G.V.R.D. Board be so advised;

4. Automobile Fleet Insurance

2) The reduction in premium resulting from the decrease in coverage be placed in a separate reserve account to be used to pay the deductible portion of any accidents which may occur during the year.

The Company is prepared to pay this amount on terms on terms of \$9,000.00 cash with the balance payable over a three year period with interest at 12% on the understanding that they will be allowed to pay out their agreement if they so wish, prior to the expiration of the three year period, with no interest penalty for prepayment.
