MINUTES

The Minutes of the Council Meeting held on 1978 May 29 came forward for adoption.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN LEWARNE: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN RANDALL:

"THAT the Minutes of the Council Meeting held on 1978 May 29 be now adopted."

Alderman Randall noted that on Page 10 of the Minutes of the Council Meeting held on 1978 May 29 no mover or seconder was shown for the following motion:

"THAT the Chief Building Inspector be instructed to take no action on illegal suites presently existing in the Municipality unless a specific complaint against such an illegal suite is received by the Municipality."

Alderman Randall advised that this motion had been Moved by Alderman Gunn and Seconded by himself.

Alderman Gunn noted that on Page 16 of the Minutes of the Council Meeting held on 1978 May 29 the following motion concerning the report of the Exempt Staff Council Committee, "THAT further consideration of this matter be tabled until such time as more members of Council are present." was shown as being CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY when, in fact, he had been opposed to this motion.

A vote was then taken on the original motion as Moved by Alderman Lewarne and Seconded by Alderman Randall, "THAT the Minutes of the Council Meeting held on 1978 May 29 be now adopted." as amended, and same was CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

a) Mr. Victor V. Stusiak, speaking on behalf of the Century Park Museum Association, then addressed Council on the subject of the proposed Heritage Village expansion. Mr. Stusiak noted that Council was in possession of a copy of the Century Park Museum Association's brief to the Parks and Recreation Commission and that because of the heavy agenda facing Council this evening he would not review this submission in detail.

The Century Park Museum Association was requesting that Council confirm the resolutions put forward by the Parks and Recreation Commission in this respect. If Council sees fit to confirm these recommendations it will permit the Century Park Museum Association to proceed with the preparation of the Capital Improvement Program and will provide an opportunity to define some boundaries and to have some opportunity to plan for the future. The Century Park Museum Association is very happy with the recommendations of the Parks and Recreation Commission. Mr. Stusiak also advised that the Association would like some clarification on a proposed 250 ft setback from Deer Lake. The Association has no firm and strong stance on that setback. The Association would urge that a definite setback be determined. It was hoped that a setback would not so destroy the use of that house at the end of Dale Avenue that it couldn't fit certain requirements. Then there is the requirement for the trail system along Dale Avenue. Mr. Stusiak pointed out that it was the Association's view, backed by the Parks and Recreation Commission, that there should be no form of public trail system through the Village because of the huge security problems which would be created together with the administrative problems that would be encountered in attempting to control a split operation.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN LEWARNE: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN RANDALL:

"THAT Item 33, Municipal Manager's Report No. 44, 1978 June 12, pertaining to this subject be brought forward for consideration at this time."

b) Mr. F. Dressler then addressed Council on the subject of the property tax notice recently received by him and the problems connected with road access to his property.

Mr. Dressler noted that he had received his tax notice recently and was shocked to see that the taxes on his twenty year home and devalued property totalled \$976.14. Mr. Dressler had phoned the tax department for an explanation as to what the taxes were for. The party to whom he was speaking said that the taxes were for sewers, road maintenance, school taxes, water rates, local improvements and so forth.

Mr. Dressler noted:

- 1. He had no children of school age.
- There is no sewer services.
- 3. He considered that he does not have a safe access from the road to his property without fear of an accident.
- There are no side shoulders or sidewalks in front of his residence as other residences in Burnaby.
- 5. There are no street lights or speed limits posted especially for traffic after dark.

Mr. Dressler went on to explain the problems encountered with road access to his property.

Mr. Dressler was of the opinion that his property had been greatly devalued as a result of the construction of the new Broadway in front of his dwelling and the lack of any other access.

c) Mr. Denver Kinnee, speaking on behalf of the East Burnaby Ratepayers Association then addressed Council on the subject of 18th Avenue and the area north of Sixth Street.

The following is the text of Mr. Kinnee's address:

'Background Information:

Last September 1977 a small delegation of Burnaby citizens met with Traffic Engineer Mr. Bacon and requested that a four way stop sign be installed at 4th Street and 18th Avenue. The reason for this request was that there had been a number of car accidents at this corner, one resulting in a fatality.

Subsequently stop signs were placed on 4th, 2nd and 1st Streets, yielding the right of way on 18th Avenue. The installation of a solid yellow center line on 18th Avenue, combined with the stop signs, has created a through street from 6th to 1st Streets, resulting in an increase in the volume and speed of commuter and commercial traffic on 18th Avenue. The creation of the through street has not stopped the accidents and has increased the danger to the many small children residing in this area. For instance, just two weeks ago a small boy was hit and sustained a broken leg.

The traffic problems at 6th Street and 16th Avenue partly caused by motorists making left hand turns onto 16th Avenue will only increase traffic volumes on 18th Avenue by people wishing to avoid this intersection. Eighteenth Avenue had always been a quiet residential street up until the installation of the stop signs and yellow line.

The citizens concerned about 18th Avenue had a meeting with the Planning and Traffic Engineers Mr. Scott and Mr. Bacon, who recommended that we canvass the residents of the area to determine a solution. In canvassing the residents, we came up with the following recommendations, which were approved by a vast majority of the taxpayers.

The recommendations are as follows:

1. Installation of a diagonal traffic diverter at the corner of 4th Street and 18th Avenue, from the Northwest corner to the southeast corner.

- 2. Removal of the yellow center line.
- Installation of a four-way stop sign at 1st Street and 18th Avenue.

We also respectfully recommend that all residents of Burnaby be notified of any proposed street changes in their area.

Your kind attention to our requests at the earliest possible opportunity will be appreciated.'

MOVED BY ALDERMAN LAWSON: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN MERCIER:

"THAT this matter be referred to the Traffic Safety Committee and that Mr. Denver Kinnee be advised of the time and date of the Traffic Safety Committee meeting at which this matter will be considered."

d) Mr. Wink Vogel, Cloverdale Investments Limited, then addressed Council on the subject of Rezoning Reference No. 1/78 at 6200 Lougheed Highway and the affect that proposed alternatives to the Kensington Overpass Alignment might have on this development.

Mr. Vogel stated that he appreciated the importance that Council must place on making a ruling regarding the overpass study. He understood that a decision at this time which was construed as either hasty or arbitrary could have difficult repercussions in solving the critical traffic and transportation problem.

Mr. Vogel further understood that the Transportation Committee are currently studying the problem and he appreciated that they also do not wish to make a hasty decision.

Mr. Vogel had again met with the Municipal Planning staff since the last Council meeting and agreed on the problems involved by both sides should the development proceed now rather than later.

Mr. Vogel respectfully suggested in view of the well documented study that his project should not be a critical factor for the Council in assessing the merits of Alternatives (b) and (b1) and that the Council could make a decision to reject Alternatives (b) and (b1) without compromising their position of impartiality in the whole matter.

Mr. Vogel was of the opinion that Council was aware of how deeply his company is involved in this particular site and how critical they view an early start of construction. Therefore, they had come to the conclusion that even if Council cannot see its way clear to eliminating Alternatives (b) and (bl) as practical solutions to the Kensington Overpass study that they will ask Council to give final reading and adoption of the by-law permitting his company to proceed with the understanding that Cloverdale Investments is aware of the potential effect on their property should Alternatives (b) or (b1) be selected as solutions to the traffic and transportation problem.

e) Mr. David LeRoux, Bumper's Discotheque, then addressed Council on the subject of extended hours of operation during the summer months for Bumper's Discotheque at 7595 Kingsway.

Mr. LeRoux advised that the Management of Bumper's feels that it would be advantageous for the teenagers of Burnaby and surrounding areas to have this facility open until midnight during school holidays, otherwise, the teenagers are turned out into the streets at 10:00 p.m. just after sunset on a summers eve. Usually a prime time for mischief. The business advantages are negligible as the admission fee remains the same and not many patrons arrive after 10:00 p.m. This is mainly done on the request of the teenagers themselves. The vast majority have worked extremely hard in their behaviour and attitude to seek the approval of adults who preside on School Board and Council. Mr. LeRoux stated that they had had no objections to the operation of Bumper's Discotheque and that the discotheque provided a much needed service to the teenagers of Burnaby and the surrounding districts.

Council was advised that a staff report on this matter would be available on June 19 and further consideration of the matter was deferred until that time.

Emanating from this reassessment, the Staff Technical Committee associated with the initial development of the park is of the opinion that certain revisions to the adopted Master Plan would be beneficial from both an operational and accessibility viewpoint.

The primary revision presently under more detailed investigation relates to the use and means of access to the eastern portions of the Marine Park where the marina and boat launching facilities are envisaged. Should the revisions under review prove feasible it is anticipated, from discussions with the Canadian Transport Commission, that the obtaining of the access approvals to the core area of the Marine Park would be greatly expedited.

Staff is presently undertaking a more detailed look at the proposed amendments including preliminary discussions with principals of Allied Chemical Limited, with a view towards submitting a report on the subject for the consideration of the Parks and Recreation Commission and the Municipal Council.
